STUDENT CHROMEBOOK ACCEPTABLE USAGE POLICY

The Hazel Crest School district provides CHROMEBOOK computers to its students (3rd-8th) as part of an 1:1 initiative that adheres to the educational mission of the District. These computers are being provided exclusively to students in a manner that assigns each Chromebook to an individual student for the entire school year. Therefore there will be no situations of multiple students (3rd-8th) using the same device. Consequently, we expect parents and students to review and understand the Chromebook Acceptable Usage Policy. Students are expected to:

1. Respect your Chromebook and use it properly. Understand that having a personal Chromebook throughout the school day is a privilege not an entitlement.
2. Protect your logon information from others. Do not use other users' passwords.
3. Be responsible in the use of your Chromebook. Do not destroy, modify or abuse the hardware or software in any way.
4. Do not delete or add software to Chromebooks without permission.
5. Do not use Chromebooks for illegal, harassing, vandalizing, inappropriate or indecent purposes.
6. Do not use the Internet to access or process inappropriate material in concert with the district Internet Safety Policy. Notify an adult immediately whenever there is information or messages on your computer that seem inappropriate.
7. Be ethical and courteous. Do not send hate, harassing or obscene mail, discriminatory remarks, or demonstrate other antisocial behaviors.
8. Do not give out any personal information over the Internet.

Violation of any of the above conditions of use may be cause for disciplinary action. Violations may constitute cause for revocation of Chromebook, suspension of access to District computers, other school disciplinary action, and/or appropriate legal action. Students that damage Chromebooks and may also be financially responsible for repairs or replacement, as determined by the principal or his/her designee.
